Dear Parent/ Carer,

In September 2014 the government scrapped National Curriculum Levels, leaving the responsibility of grading students with individual schools. Assessment grades are vital as they let everyone know how much progress a student is making in each subject. We have developed an assessment process at HNS which informs you about how well your child is progressing compared to how well we think they can do.

We formally assess students three times a year which we refer to as Assessment Points. Students receive a grade (ranging from A to G) in the subjects they study after each Assessment Point. A grade A indicates that a student has reached a high standard and that we expect that they will, at GCSE, perform in line with the top 15% in the country in that particular subject. We do not have a formal “pass” mark but grades below a D are indicative of serious underperformance in that subject. We advise students to seek advice from their teacher or attend an intervention where their grades are below a D.

We expect students to master the content that is taught during the year. By the Summer term students should be able to answer questions using knowledge or skills taught in September. As such, maintaining a grade A throughout the year is a challenging task. A student who maintains a grade C throughout the year is considered to be making good progress.

Please note that we expect students to have at least 98% attendance. Similarly, we expect every student to complete homework in all subjects when homework is assigned. Non-completion of homework is one of the key indicators of underachievement and underperformance.

All students in Year 8 will be completing Assessment Point 3 (AP3) examinations across all subjects in July 2018. The exams will be

This process is to help ensure that students are fully informed when they make their GCSE choices (February 2019) and are prepared for their transition into GCSE courses. We want the AP3 examinations to be challenging to Year 8 students and the rigour that they entail will hopefully provide a solid foundation for the demands of GCSE study. It is vital that students prepare for these important examinations in order to gain confidence and knowledge as they move into the extremely important and choice-enhancing years of Key Stage 4 study (GCSE) and ultimately provide them with the results and achievements which can enable them to make the right and informed choices about their future. The exams will also give us a detailed picture of each student's current level of attainment in each subject and the subsequent steps that they need to take in order to make further progress.

During AP3 examinations, students will register at the normal time of 8 am in their form bases. During lessons each day, students will sit tests in examination conditions and teachers will inform each class when the examination will take place during that week. All students will have opportunities to revise for the tests and ask their subject teachers for advice and guidance in the weeks leading up to and including the AP3 examinations.

We expect students to bring all necessary examination equipment with them in **a clear pencil case. Essential equipment includes black pens, pencils, a ruler, a protractor, compasses and an eraser. Students should also ensure that they have a scientific calculator as the use of a calculator is allowed some Mathematics and Science exams.** Furthermore, we see Year 8 AP3 Examinations week as an opportunity to train students in proper examination procedures and etiquette. All AP3 results will be sent by post to parents/carers before the end of the academic year.

We continue to value your strong support for our school and we would ask you to take some time to go over this information with your child to ensure that they are fully prepared for the forthcoming examinations.
